## The Spirit of Truth Who Issues from the Father, He Will Be My Witness

Jesus helps us know the origin of the Holy Spirit, who issues from God the Father. He added, "everything the Father has is mine," and "All he [the Holy Spirit] tells you will be taken from what is mine." From what Jesus explains, we believe and understand that the Holy Spirit proceeds from both the Father and Jesus. For this reason, to believe in God is to believe in Jesus and in the Holy Spirit, and to believe in Jesus is to believe in God and in the Holy Spirit, and to believe in the Holy Spirit is to believe in God and in Jesus. In the world, the Holy Spirit is present in many cultures, languages, and religions, and there are people who know the Holy Spirit and know that the Holy Spirit is God. However, not everyone who knows the Holy Spirit knows Jesus as God.

As St. Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said to the Athenians, "I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we too are his offspring.'" (Acts 17:22-28).

St. Paul was anointed with the Holy Spirit and his speech fulfills the teaching of Christ about the presence and the power of the Holy Spirit who abides fully in Jesus and in those that Jesus chose for himself. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." In today's world too, the Holy Spirit abides in anyone who believes in Jesus and allows His Spirit to kindle in them the power of his love. *Fr. Tien Cao*

## 1. Senior Leadership Team (SLT) - What is it?

"If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together" Ancient Proverb. The typical church model is one in which the Parish Priest is responsible for everything. In some parishes priests have been able to delegate tasks to individuals, committees or teams. However, the delegation of tasks is not the same as the delegation of leadership. Leadership means assuming responsibility rather than completing tasks. We can understand it in terms of a co-responsibility for the mission of the church that is rooted in our baptismal vocation. In charity, please pray for our parish for a formation of a senior leadership team who will complement the skills of the parish priest to ensure the parish is led effectively. They are not part of a team led by the parish priest but leaders through whom he can lead more effectively. So instead of the parish priest leading a team, we can genuinely say that the parish priest is 'leading out of a team'.

"Co-responsibility demands a change in mindset especially concerning the role of lay people in the Church. They should not be regarded as "collaborators" of the clergy, but, rather, as people who are really "co-responsible" for the Church's being and acting. It is therefore important that a mature and committed laity be consolidated, which can make its own specific contribution to the ecclesial mission with respect for the ministries and tasks that each one has in the life of the Church and always in cordial communion with the bishops" Pope Benedict XVI, Message to the Sixth Ordinary Assembly of the International Forum of Catholic Action, 10/08/2012.

- **2. Pray Before Every Sunday Mass:** We have been excited to reintroduce this ancient prayer that we believe encapsulates our shared aspirations for our community: 'Invoking the Holy Spirit: A Prayer for Parish Transformation and Growth.'
