FIRST READING • (Wisdom 7:7-11). There is a sense of measure in the life of a wise person. The wise know what is possible and what is not.
SECOND READING • (Hebrews 4:12-13). The Word of God is the truth of things and there is no hiding from it. The truth is not there to condemn or make one feel bad. Jesus said that the truth will make us free. The Word of God expands our horizons to see the grace and love which is at the heart of all.
GOSPEL • (Mark 10:17-30). Security is not found in things. As they pass, their limitations become evident. The ultimate security is found in surrender to God's

presence. From youth to old age, his love is the constant in our lives

The one thing we all lack is not earthly riches or possessions but treasure in heaven - eternal life, which we receive as a gift from God. Eternal life is not manufactured or created by medical advancement or technology. It is a participation in the very life of God Himself. Jesus reminds us that while eternal life is impossible for humans to attain on our own, everything is possible with God (Mark 10:27).

Eternal life has already begun in our human life and it is so precious to God that Jesus Christ willingly laid down His life for us to restore and renew our life both now and forever. Jesus loves each life unconditionally, defending human dignity and life beyond what we could ever deserve. He said, "There is no greater love than to lay down one's life for one's friends" (John 15:13). The teaching and good works of Jesus have shown us that no matter the gravity of a person's sins or moral failures, their dignity remains intact because they are made in the image and likeness of God (Gen 1:27). In God's infinite mercy, no one is beyond redemption. As the saying goes, "Every Saint has a past, and every sinner has a future."

On this Support Life Sunday, we are called to do everything in our power to protect the infinite dignity of every human being. Every life matters... always! He mea nui te ora o ngā tāngata katoa... i ngā wā katoa!

Supporting life, as Jesus teaches, must be rooted in the understanding that each person receives their dignity from God, no matter their mental or physical condition, health, or perceived "usefulness" in society. It is on this foundation that we stand to defend and promote the sanctity of life. We proclaim that every human person possesses an inalienable, infinite dignity—one that exists in and beyond every circumstance. This truth, grounded in our very being, is confirmed by both reason and divine revelation. Every life, at every stage and in every condition, is to be cherished and safeguarded, no matter the challenges faced.

Finally, this Sunday's Gospel, along with the recent COVID-19 pandemic, has taught us how fragile and fleeting earthly riches are. Many had wealth but were unable to buy health or extend life. This lesson reminds us that both life on earth and eternal life are gifts, not entitlements. We have no right to take anyone's life because life itself is a gift that only God can give and sustain. The one thing we all lack is the eternal life that is hidden in Christ, who tells us, "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full" (John 10:10). May our faith in Christ enlighten us to see and participate in God's life now and forever. *Fr. Tien Cao*
