# TWENTY NINETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR B

19th & 20th Oct 2024

FIRST READING • (Isaiah 53:10-11) The prophet describes the turning point in the mission of a special messenger of God, who is called the Servant.

SECOND READING • (Hebrews 4:14-16) The preacher exhorts the listeners to have trust in Jesus who is capable of sympathising with human fragility.

GOSPEL • (Mark 10:35-45) The disciples look for eminence, but Jesus shows that service is the true way of following his example.

## Jesus Came Not to Be Served, But to Serve

Leadership is crucial. It provides direction, inspires action, and unites people toward common goals. This is why our parish has recently formed a leadership team that fosters trust, encourages collaboration, and helps individuals reach their full potential, ensuring progress and growth in our faith community. In these challenging times, strong leadership can offer stability and confidence, encouraging resilience and innovation. Our team members, though human and imperfect, rely on God's grace to support one another. Please pray for our team. As your priest, I am not here on holiday - I am here to serve you.

In the context of our faith, the greatest leader is the most-humble servant of God. Despite their own weaknesses, these leaders remain faithful to God's wise instruction. Bad leaders disobey God, and so true greatness in leadership, as taught by Christ, is not about being in charge, but about being in charge by God. This is evident among the figures in both the Old and New Testaments, such as Noah, Abraham, Moses, David, and Mary, as well as in the founders of religious orders throughout Church history. These figures are called "servants of God" as illustrated in Jeremiah: "But you, Jacob, my servant, do not be afraid" (Jeremiah 46:28), and in Psalm 123: "As the eyes of servants look to the hand of their master... so our eyes look to the Lord our God" (Ps 123:2). Mary herself said to the angel Gabriel, "Yes, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be done to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38).

The servants of God in the Bible foreshadowed the coming of Jesus, the ultimate Servant of God and the Servant of the New Covenant. Jesus Christ, who is the same yesterday, today, and forever, is the perfect model of leadership. His mission was clear: He came not to be served but to serve, for this is the nature of authentic love, truth, goodness, and beauty. Jesus inspires us to imitate Him, not only by realizing our own greatness but by empowering others to achieve theirs. He tells us, "You know that among the pagans, their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be the slave of all" (Mark 10:42-44).

Jesus knows that imitating the world's style of leadership is futile; it wastes time, energy, and life itself. He offers a different path - the path of servant leadership, rooted in humility, love, and a desire to serve others.

Finally, this Sunday's Gospel invites us to reflect: how has Jesus been a leader in my life and in the life of my family? (Mk 10:35-45). Who is leading my child right now? Do they know Jesus?
