TWENTY SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - YEAR B

5th & 6th Oct 2024

FIRST READING • (Genesis 2:18-24). This story outlines the essentials of marriage. The woman and the man leave the security of their own families. Their strength is now in each other as they embark on an adventure together. In this journey, they are sustained by partnership and the mingling of their lives. SECOND READING • (Hebrews 2:9-11). The reading touches on the brotherhood of Jesus in the context of his sufferings. In dark moments, it is the suffering of Christ that speaks most tellingly to us. His crucified presence is with us in unbroken fellowship.

GOSPEL • (Mark 10:2-16). The stability of the marriage vows anchors the relationship and gives a platform to begin and begin again.

Jesus said: What God Has Joined Together, No Human Being Must Separate

Marriage, having its origin in the One loving God, bears a sacred meaning. As St. Paul wrote to the Ephesians: "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave Himself up for her" (Ephesians 5:25). Marriage love reflects God's love for the world in Christ. Thus, when you vow: "I, ..., take you, ..., to be my wife/husband. I promise to be true to you in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health. I will love you and honor you all the days of my life," your words signify a lifelong commitment to mutual love and fidelity, regardless of the challenges you might face.

The priest witnesses this vow on behalf of the Church and society, but it is the couple's consent that establishes the marriage bond. Thus, no one enters a marriage expecting it to end in divorce or separation. Every couple desires to be happy, growing old together. Yet, the reality often falls short of this ideal. Many factors in our world can cause marriages to end and tear families apart; financial anxieties, abuses, concerns over health, new opportunities, children, technology, and negative influences. These pressures can weaken the spark of love that first united the couple. When human love falters, it often turns from a source of joy into a burden, limiting personal freedom in a world that values individualism. In such a culture, the meaning of being together fades, and sacrificial love becomes a demand rather than a joyful offering.

Despite these challenges, we witness the courage of those who remain faithful to their vows. Both within the Church and outside it, people strive to uphold Christ's true teaching on marriage. In doing so, they find God's blessings and guidance for their marital bond and family. Around us, young people still commit themselves to Christ's ideal for marriage. As Jesus did, may we continue to pray for and support those who are married, especially those struggling. Let us show them compassion and empathy, but not judgement.

Finally, Jesus solidifies the true bond of marriage in His response to the Pharisees (Mark 10:2-16). While the Pharisees focused on the law, Jesus emphasized God's will for marriage. He pointed back to its sacred origin, rooted in the One God who is Love. Marriage is a sacred bond, and Jesus desires to be present in the life of every married couple. His grace and truth can strengthen our love, enabling us to follow God's will and live a life of sanctity. What God has joined together, no human being must separate. *Fr. Tien Cao*
