READINGS AT MASS

FIRST READING • (1 Kings 17:10-16). The widow of Sidon shares her last meal with the prophet Elijah and is rewarded by God.

SECOND READING • (Hebrews 9:24-28). Jesus stands in the presence of God to intercede on our behalf.

GOSPEL • (Mark 12:38-44). The rich contribute lavishly to Temple funds from their surplus, but Jesus commends the poor widow who gives her all.

Jesus' Praise of the Widow's Radical Trust in God

Jesus reveals the depth of the widow's faith in God's providence. Through the Gospel of Mark, we see that this poor widow contributed only two small coins to the treasury, an amount that equaled a mere penny. Yet, it was everything she possessed, all she had to live on (Mk 12:38-44). Her manner of giving illustrates a radical trust in God; her life did not rely on what she 'had,' but on who she 'was,' a generous and trusting daughter of God. In a way, she risked everything on God's faithfulness, consecrating her entire life to Him. Her devotion reminds us that in God's eyes, who we 'are' matters far more than what we 'possess.'

Too often, from a worldly perspective, we value ourselves and others by 'what we have' rather than 'who we are.' The poor widow calls us back to a higher truth: God values us for who we are, not for what we have. In commending her, Jesus reminds His disciples, and us, that it is no shame to live simply and to depend upon God's providence. The widow's poverty was not by chance; it was a choice, an act of faith, as she entrusted her whole being to God's care. She did not invest in earthly securities; she stored her treasure in heaven, where no moth can destroy and no thief can steal (Mt 6:19-20).

Through her humble offering, the poor widow teaches us three powerful lessons: trust in God's constant care, a call not to worry about tomorrow, and the truth that generosity draws us closer to God, who is the Giver of all.

Besides, this Sunday's Gospel reassures us that no act of kindness, however small, is overlooked by God, and no good deed goes unrewarded. The image of Christ watching those who donated at the temple reminds us that God sees all we do, and He lovingly observes how we live. Day and night, He watches over His children. Even the smallest gesture, like giving a cup of cold water, is precious in His sight. As St. Francis of Assisi said, "It is in giving that we receive."

Lastly, the supreme example of giving is Jesus Himself, who gives us His very life in the Eucharist. When He says, "Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is My Body...My Blood," He gives not what He has, but who He is. May we learn from His generosity and become generous with God and one another. Like Jesus, let us give until it hurts, so that we may know what it truly means to be generous.
