READINGS AT MASS

FIRST READING • (Daniel 12:1-3). Life does not end with death. Beyond the grave we shall live with God.

SECOND READING • (Hebrews 10:11-14.18). Christ's perfect sacrifice has brought the sacrificial system to an end, and has sanctified all those who believe in him.

GOSPEL • (Mark 13:24-32). The Gospel looks to the return of Christ as Judge. No one can predict when the Lord will come, but that he will come is certain.

The Unveiling of God's Full Glory in Christ

The great power and glory of God is the daily language of faith. It is manifested in all things and in every person, both seen and unseen. Every visible sign of life and existence is an illustration of God's glory and power. Every invisible reality, such as angels and unseen forces, also manifests His glory. Yet, Jesus Christ is the supreme manifestation of God's glory and power. He is the visible face of the invisible God, the embodiment of divine love and glory. Through participation in His life and communion, we too become vessels of God's glory and power. We recognize the glory of God in the miracles Jesus performed and in the lives of those who fully abide in Him—such as the saints and those living righteously in our world today.

The Gospel this Sunday (Mk 13:24–32) points us to the fullness of God's glory at the Second Coming of Christ. This moment will mark the accountability of wickedness and evil and the complete unveiling of God's glory and power. Jesus reminds us that all creation has an appointed time, and only that which belongs to Him will endure forever.

Christ describes the cosmic signs that will herald His return: "The sun will be darkened, the moon will not give its light, the stars will fall, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken." (Mk 13:24–25). These signs signal that the transient light of the cosmos will give way to the eternal light of Christ's glory. For Christians, the custodians of God's glory, this is a day of hope and fulfillment— a day to look forward to with joyful anticipation.

Pope Francis likens our waiting for the Lord's coming to the expectancy of a pregnant mother waiting to meet her child. Though mother and child have not yet seen each other, a profound relationship already exists. Similarly, God eagerly looks forward to meeting us face to face. Just as parents lovingly prepare for their child's arrival, God has prepared everything for us in eternity.

To sum up, this image underscores how deeply God loves us. The Second Coming is not a moment of fear but of profound love—a time when we will be born into eternal life. Today's Gospel encourages us to prepare for this encounter. God knows the appointed time and is ready to welcome us. Are we preparing ourselves to meet Him?

When we stand before the Lord, we will see Him face to face, and His name, written on our foreheads at baptism, will mark us as His own. This indelible sign of His ownership assures us that we belong to Him, now and forever. *Fr. Tien Cao*
