READINGS AT MASS

FIRST READING - Deuteronomy 6:2-6. To love God means to keep his commandments, especially the great Commandment of love.

SECOND READING - Hebrews 5:1-6. This reading shows the superiority of Christ over the priests of the Old Testament.

GOSPEL - Mark 12:23-28. Jesus tells us what the two most important of God's commandments are.

Christ's Call to Love: Centering Our Lives on God and Neighbor

Jesus shepherds us to center our lives on loving God and our neighbors as a Email: priority, because when we follow these paths, he will meet us along the way (Mt 25:40). He will remain and abide in us and with us, so life is never lonely. However, if we follow other wrong paths, he cannot join us, especially if what we **PARISH MASS TIMES** do is sinful and unfavorable to God and our neighbors. Christ knows that those who intentionally love God and their neighbors will be set on fire - their time will **FAIRLIE - ST. PATRICK'S** always feel short, and their energy may be depleted; yet, their soul remains Sunday 9:30 am tranquil and at peace. On the contrary, when we love the world, even with ample Tue – Fri time and occasional acts of kindness, our lives may still feel dull and unfulfilled. Jesus knows that we deserve the best and happiest way of life, so he summarizes everything for us by teaching us to center and re-center our lives on loving God and our neighbors.

Christ himself has done it. He is the way, the truth, and the life. The entire life of TWIZEL – All Saints' Christ was centered on loving God and humanity. Now, he is risen and alive among us, and so whoever centers their lives on loving God and others will encounter him.

Loving God means actively seeking to know God's will in all things. In prayer, we constantly ask God for what is most loving and the greatest good in all that we **Last Sunday of the Month:** do and encounter. We avoid following our own presumptions and resist being coerced by the wrong proposals of the world. Jesus emphasizes the importance of worshipping the one God as a priority, because, like the people of Israel, we too Parish Council can fall into the temptation of idolatry. Moses instructed his people to worship the One God of Israel, while their neighbors worshipped other gods. So, to love God is to worship the One God, avoiding idolatry and the false gods who give us empty promises.

Loving our neighbors means actively and intentionally finding ways to love them. Leonie Guiney As C.S. Lewis once said, "Humility is not thinking less of yourself; it's thinking of vourself less." We all have urgent and important work to do; however, when our neighbor asks for help, they are not a distraction or a nuisance, they give us an opportunity to express our hidden love.

Finally, the Word of God today invites us to center our lives on God first, above all other things. The Word of God also calls us to love our neighbor, for loving God and loving our neighbor go hand in hand; one strengthens and empowers the other. The love of God initiates and infuses our love for our neighbor. May our M. 027 685 8659 constant reception of the Eucharist every Sunday help us center our lives on faith in the One God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All Souls' Day, which follows, is a day to remember and pray for the souls of the faithful departed. It emphasizes the Church's belief in purgatory, where souls are purified before entering heaven. This day offers the faithful an opportunity to intercede for their deceased loved ones, reflecting the Church's teaching on the communion of saints.
