14th & 15th Dec 2024

Preparation Prevents Poor Performance

FIRST READING • (Zephaniah 3:14-18). The prophet looks forward to a day of celebration to mark the Lord being in the midst of the people.

SECOND READING • (Philippians 4:4-7). True happiness and true peace are to be found in committing our hearts and thoughts to the Lord Jesus. GOSPEL • (Luke 3:10-18). In his preaching John the Baptist tries to open our eyes to practical, day-to-day charity.

'Someone Is Coming Who Will Baptize You with The Holy Spirit and Fire'

A teacher was sent to a new primary school. For the first few weeks, things went very well for her. However, some weeks later, she received a letter from one of the little children: "Dear Mrs. Smith, we are happy that you have come to our school, and we really enjoy your teaching. We also hope that you enjoy teaching us, and if you like us, please inform your face." The smile on our face indicates the internal joy of our heart. Sometimes, people need to know that we are joyful to be with them. Or as people say, how do you face the problem of life if the problem is your face?

The third Sunday of Advent is also called *Gaudete Sunday*, the Sunday of Joy (Lk 3:10-18). Christian joy is different from worldly joy; it is deeper and comes directly from the hidden power of the Holy Spirit. It is one of the fruits of our faith, hope, and love. To use the image of a tree: believing in God, hoping in God, and loving God are the three roots, and joy, peace, love, patience, kindness, generosity, etc., are the fruits. They are the results of our knowledge of and prayers in relation to God.

Through baptism, the Holy Spirit is the cause of our inner joy. The indwelling of the Holy Spirit in the baptized person takes away loneliness and anxiety because they know God is near. St. Paul wrote to the Philippians, saying: "The Lord is very near. There is no need to worry; but if there is anything you need, pray for it, asking God for it with prayer and thanksgiving, and that peace of God, which is so much greater than we can understand, will guard your hearts and your thoughts, in Christ Jesus" (4:4-7). When St. Paul wrote this letter to the Philippians, it did not mean that their community and individual families had no trouble. It did not mean that the society and socioeconomic situation of the Philippians were perfect. No, like us who experience unpleasant and unwanted situations, they too had their own issues to handle. However, instead of spending their precious time and energy mourning and complaining about their circumstances, St. Paul encouraged them to put their total trust in God. He reminded them of the power of prayer when they were worried, saying, if there is anything you need, pray for it.

Finally, the book of Zephaniah gives us more reasons to be joy-filled missionary disciples (3:14-18). It is not about having convenience; it is about being bearers and beacons of hope for one another. We are not allowed to lose hope in times of distress, because "the Lord our God is in our midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over us, he will renew us by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for us."
