FIRST READING: (Micah 5:1-4) The prophet Micah announces to the beleaguered inhabitants of Jerusalem that a Ruler will come from Bethlehem who will bring them peace.

SECOND READING: (Hebrews 10:5-10) Jesus came, not to offer the sacrifices of the old law, but to do the will of God. His one perfect sacrifice replaced all the former sacrifices.

GOSPEL: (Luke 1:39-45) Elizabeth praises Mary, and, enlightened by the Holy Spirit, hints at the uniqueness of the child she has conceived.

The Visitation

Jesus Comes to Us Through Mary and the Holy Spirit

The Gospel of Luke (1:39-45) recounts Mary's visitation to Elizabeth, a profound moment filled with love, joy, and divine purpose. Mary, carrying Jesus in her womb, embarks on a selfless journey to visit her cousin Elizabeth, who is six months pregnant with John the Baptist. Despite her young age and the challenges of traveling over 100 kilometers, Mary humbly serves Elizabeth, embodying virtues of love, humility, and service. Her actions remind us that true greatness lies in caring for others.

This encounter signifies more than familial love; it reveals God's saving plan. Through Mary's greeting, Elizabeth is filled with the Holy Spirit, and John the Baptist leaps for joy in her womb. This moment fulfills the angel Gabriel's words that "nothing will be impossible with God." It illustrates how God's grace transcends human limitations—Elizabeth conceives in old age, Mary bears the Son of God, and John is anointed even before birth.

Mary's visitation symbolizes the coming of Jesus, bringing joy and the Holy Spirit to prepare John for his prophetic mission. It emphasizes that God's power can override natural laws, as seen in the miraculous pregnancies of Mary and Elizabeth. Through Mary's voice, the Spirit flows, affirming the interconnectedness of God's work in salvation history.

Today's Gospel invites us to reflect on three points:

- 1. Mary, our spiritual mother, intercedes for us, urging us to pray the Joyful Mysteries for renewed joy.
- 2. Receiving the Eucharist, we carry Christ within us, like Mary, and are called to bring His joy to others.
- 3. Listening to God's Word empowers us to fulfill our vocation and mission. Let us, like Mary, become joy-filled missionary disciples, sharing Christ's love and Gospel with the world.
