Isaiah 43:16-21. I am doing a new thing and I will give a drink to my people. Philippians 3:8-14. Because of Christ I look upon everything else as useless in order to gain him. John 8:1-11. Jesus Defines True Justice: Saving a Woman Who Was Condemned to Death.

Jesus Defines True Justice: Saving a Woman Who Was Condemned to Death

Today's Gospel message is one of redemption. Jesus is present at the right time and in the right place to rescue a woman who had been condemned to death for the sin of adultery. We believe that anyone else, no matter their sin, who is brought to Jesus with a repentant heart can also be forgiven in the same way. Jesus looks first at the person, not the sin, teaching us that before we judge anyone, we must learn to see them as beloved children of God, not with the merciless gaze of the scribes and Pharisees, who looked first at the sin and were blinded to the person.

We know that only God can forgive sins, and today, Jesus reveals that He is God. Jesus shows us that to truly forgive others, we must be willing to make a sacrifice, even to the point of taking the blame upon ourselves. This is a voluntary act of selfless love, extended even to those who may or may not seem to deserve it.

Let us pause and reflect on the justice systems in our world: are they more inclined to protect or to condemn? As Christians, can we do anything about it? When do people say to us, "Thank God you are here"?

Let us not be trapped in the past sins and guilt, our own or others,' but instead believe in the future that Christ's redemption makes possible. St. Paul teaches us: "One thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal, the prize of God's heavenly call in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:13–14).

Ultimately, Jesus has come to reveal true justice to our world. To know Jesus is to know what is right, righteous, and virtuous. St. Paul declared, "I believe nothing can outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." As Psalm 126 proclaims: "The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." May we too be people of joy and justice, radiating and spreading the fragrance of Christ's mercy and inner peace wherever we go.

God writes straight with crooked lines. We are not to live in the guilt of past sins, nor should we expect perfection of ourselves or of others, a perfection that belongs to God alone. Instead, we are to see ourselves and others as God sees us: people on a journey.

6. Support of Lent Appeal is an 'act of generosity': The New Zealand Catholic Bishops of Aotearoa NZ asks Caritas to run a six-week fundraising campaign on their behalf called the Bishop's Lent Appeal. The money raised during this time is essential to the mission of Caritas. It provides much of the funding necessary for them to continue their life-changing work in Aotearoa, the Pacific and beyond. This year's appeal is even more urgent than usual. The US government recently stopped almost all foreign aid, France, the Netherlands, Switzerland, Germany & UK have also cut their overseas budgets. Your support is needed so Caritas can step in across the Pacific as donor governments withdraw.
