- Heb 9:24-28;1019-23. Christ has entered heaven.
- Lk 24:46-53. While blessing them, he was taken to heaven.

The Ascension: Christ Is Waiting For Us In Heaven

It is said, "When we do not know how to move forward or backward, then we should go upward." Going upward is not merely a direction; it is a spiritual orientation of lifting our hearts toward the immortality of heaven, namely, toward God. In this life, we often face uncertainty and suffering. The answer is not to retreat or fall into despair, but to fix our eyes above. As Christians, our gaze is drawn heavenward because Christ, our Head, has gone before us in glory. The Solemnity of the Ascension teaches us to reorient our lives not downward, into the distractions and mortality of the world, but upward, toward divine life.

The Gospel of Luke records a glorious event: "Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven" (Lk 24:50–53). Jesus was lifted from the earth in the sight of his disciples, in a posture of blessing. This gesture is not just symbolic; it reveals his abiding desire to protect and guide his Church. With arms open in benediction, Jesus shows that even as he departs in bodily form, he does not abandon us. The disciples' response is telling: "They worshipped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God." Their joy did not come from seeing Jesus leave, but from the promise that he is now enthroned in glory, preparing a place for them, and for us.

The Church captures this mystery beautifully in the Collect of today's Mass: "Gladden us with holy joys, almighty God, and make us rejoice with devout thanksgiving, for the Ascension of Christ your Son is our exaltation, and where the Head has gone before in glory, the Body is called to follow in hope." This prayer explains the reason for our joy: through the Ascension, Christ has brought our humanity into heaven. In Jesus, true God and true man, our human nature, your nature and mine, has entered into eternal communion with the Father. This is why the Ascension is not only historical, but also transcendental. It happened in time and was witnessed by the disciples. But its significance reaches beyond time. Our human destiny is no longer confined to earth or to death. In Christ, humanity has already begun to share in the divine glory. And through Baptism, we become part of this mystery. We are made members of the Mystical Body of Christ, and so where the Head has gone, the Body must follow. This gives meaning to our Christian journey: when we have completed our earthly path, we shall be united with Christ in glory. Heaven is not a vague dream; it is our true home, and Christ is there, waiting for us.

Finally, Jesus has gone ahead to prepare a place for us, as he himself promised: "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also" (Jn 14:3). Jesus does not want us to remain in mortality, but to live in immortality with him. Let us respond to this great mystery with faith, hope, and joy.
