READINGS AT MASS

- Gen 14:18-20. Melchizedek brought bread and wine.
- 1 Cor. Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming the death of the Lord.
- Lk 9:11-17. They all ate and were filled.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

At the Last Supper, Jesus instituted the Eucharist and the Priesthood because he loves us and wants to perpetuate his presence in us and with us. In the Eucharist, Jesus fulfils his promise: "I am with you always, even until the end of the world" (Mt 28:20). Through the Priesthood, Jesus continues forgiving, anointing, blessing, and shepherding His disciples. 'O how great is the priest! If he realized what he is, he would die... God obeys him: he utters a few words and the Lord descends from heaven at his voice, to be contained within a small host" St. John Vianney. Jesus is the Eternal High Priest who dies no more, he remains the Sacrificial Lamb who takes away the sins of the world forever.

Jesus wants us to experience him in the Church as his early apostles experienced him when he became incarnate. Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever. And so, today's solemnity of *Corpus Christi* invites us to honour the sacrificial love and real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Like us, Jesus has a Body to live, to communicate, to receive, and to express love. In the Eucharist, Jesus continues to communicate and express his love for us and with us. The Mass is not our performance, every action in this celebration contains and communicates Christ's work of salvation for the world; his Last Supper, Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Christ is the centre of our liturgy. He joins our memory to that of his people at the Passover in Egypt. He unites us with his apostles at the Last Supper. He connects our current memory with the final banquet of God in the future.

Today's Gospel about the feeding of the five thousand tells us that everyone who followed Jesus that day was fed with satisfaction, they ate as much as they wanted, and there were still twelve baskets of leftovers (Lk 9:11–17). This miracle of the five loaves and two fish reveals Jesus' generosity and his power to provide. It was an extraordinary sign, helping all to see that, although Jesus appeared to be an ordinary man, he was also divine. Through his words and miraculous deeds, Jesus revealed the power of God. He is the Face, the Power, the Love, and the Presence of God, the Most Holy Trinity among us.

Finally, through the power of the Eucharist, Jesus perpetuates his love in us and among us. Let us love him and adore him! As St. John Vianney once recognised: "What happiness do we not find in the presence of God, when we find ourselves alone at his feet before the tabernacle. Ah! If we had the eyes of the angels—seeing our Lord Jesus Christ who is present on this altar and who is looking at us, how we would love Him! We would wish to remain always at His feet."
