• Rom 8:8-17. Everyone moved by the Spirit is a child of God.

• John 14: 16-16;23-26. The Holy Spirit will teach you everything.

Jesus Comforts the Disciples: God Will Give You Another Advocate

God will give you another Advocate to be with you forever. The Advocate is the Holy Spirit, whose name in Greek is the *Paraclete* that is, one who is called to our side to help and to guide us, especially through difficult times. Jesus assured us that the Holy Spirit will remain with us forever. This is deeply significant. People often say, "You can't take your money with you when you die." That is true. When death comes, even our wealth, success, and achievements stay behind. Our family and friends will accompany us to the grave, but then they return to their lives. Who remains with us is the Holy Spirit now and at the hour of our death. He alone bridges and brings us into eternity, into the very life of God.

St. Irenaeus taught: "By no other means could we have attained to incorruptibility and immortality, unless we had been united to incorruptibility and immortality, unless, first, incorruptibility and immortality had become that which we also are?" He meant that in Jesus Christ, true God and true man, who is the one that has united divinity with humanity. In him, the immortal God takes on our mortal flesh so that we may share in God's own immortality. This is made possible through the Holy Spirit, the gift of divine life poured into our hearts.

On Pentecost Sunday, fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. This has fulfilled the promise of Jesus: "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you." This illustrates that there is no discontinuity or rupture between the time Jesus walked with his disciples and the time after his Ascension. The same Holy Spirit who animated Jesus' mission now lives in the Church. The Holy Spirit continues Christ's work and makes him present in every believer.

Today, that same Spirit dwells in us and among us. With trust, let us be be attentive to his voice, and be docile to his promptings. Let us live our lives for the glory of God. As St. Paul reminds us: "The love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. Alleluia!" (Romans 5:5).
