READINGS AT MASS

- Isaiah 66:10-14. I will send toward Jerusalem peace like a river.
- Galatians 6:14-18. The marks I carry on my body are those of Jesus Christ.
- Luke 10:1-12, 17-20. Your peace will rest upon them.

Jesus says; The Kingdom of God Is Near to You

Today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus appointed seventy-two disciples and sent them out ahead of him, two by two, to every town and place he himself intended to visit (Luke 10:1–12, 17–20). This act reflects not only Jesus' divine foresight but also his role as a masterful leader. The spread of the Gospel is not random or accidental, it is intentional, deliberate, and willed by God. He desires that all people come to know him through the Good News. When the Good News is known, people renounce the worship of idols, placing their faith in God rather than submitting to fake news, lies, and falsehoods. When the Good News is received, peace is offered to those who welcome it, and for those who believe, even sickness is healed.

The mission entrusted to the seventy-two is not limited to them alone. It is a mission that Jesus entrusts to each one of us. In the kingdom of God, there is a place and a purpose for everyone. We are not to be afraid. God does not call the equipped; rather, he equips those he calls. When we are invited to serve, in a ministry, a group, or through our personal witness, let us respond with faith and generosity.

Jesus sent the disciples out in pairs as a reminder that the path of discipleship is not one that we walk alone. He calls us into community, into fraternal love and mutual support. In proclaiming the Gospel together, we also grow in mutual love for one another. This shared mission becomes a way for us to deepen our relationships and strengthen our Christian fellowship.

The core message Jesus gave to the disciples was this: "The kingdom of God is very near to you." The presence of the missionary disciples signifies the 'nearness' of God's kingdom, but when Jesus himself is present, the kingdom of God is fully and truly present as a 'living reality.' Wherever Jesus is, there the kingdom of God is also. When we hear others speak of God, we are reminded that his kingdom is near. But when we personally encounter Jesus in prayer, in the sacraments, especially in the Eucharist, we must believe and come to know that the kingdom is not only near; it is within us. Through baptism, we become children of the kingdom. Through the Eucharist, we live the life of grace within the Church, which is the seed and beginning of God's kingdom on earth.

Ultimately, the fullness of the kingdom will be revealed when Jesus returns in glory at the end of time. Until then, we live as pilgrims of hope, we who have tasted the first fruits of the kingdom and yet still long for its perfection in eternity. Let us remain faithful, joyful, and mission-oriented as we journey together toward that glorious day.
