### OUR LADY OF THE ASSUMPTION - YEAR C

16th & 17th August 2025

Mary Is Taken Up to Heaven, and the Angels of God Shout for Joy

"The sanctuary of God in heaven opened and the ark of the covenant could be seen inside it. Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown" (Revelation 11:19; 12:1-6,10). This vision helps us understand the mystery of Our Lady's Assumption into heaven. Mary is revealed as the Ark of God's covenant, for her womb, and indeed her entire immaculate being, was the dwelling place of the Word of God, who "became flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). Jesus Christ is the Emmanuel, "God with us" (Matthew 1:23).

In the Old Testament, the Ark of the Covenant was kept in the midst of God's chosen people as a sign of his presence, especially during their journey through the wilderness. God had commanded: "Have them make a sanctuary for me, and I will dwell among them" (Exodus 25:8). With the Ark in their midst, Israel was protected from their enemies (Numbers 10:35) and assured that the Lord would never abandon them (Deuteronomy 31:6). The Ark contained manna and the tablets of the Ten Commandments. The manna prefigured the Eucharist, for Christ himself declared: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:51). The Ten Commandments embodied the covenant way of life: "You shall walk in all the way that the Lord your God has commanded you, that you may live" (Deuteronomy 5:33). These signs distinguished God's people from the nations around them. When the Israelites entered the promised land and the kingdom of David was established, the Ark was brought into Jerusalem and placed in the Holy of Holies within the Temple of God (2 Samuel 6:12-17). In this, we see a foreshadowing of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Having borne Christ, and having completed her earthly pilgrimage, she, the true dwelling place of the Lord, was assumed into heaven, the ultimate Promised Land. As Jesus himself assured his disciples: "In my Father's house are many rooms; I go to prepare a place for you" (John 14:2-3).

Today, as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption, we rejoice with the angels in heaven and with all the faithful on earth. Mary proclaims for us: "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior" (Luke 1:46-47). She is our hope, because we too are earthen vessels carrying God's Spirit through baptism (2 Corinthians 4:7). Through the Eucharist, our mortal bodies, though destined to return to dust, are sanctified, for "the body is not meant for destruction, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power" (1 Corinthians 6:13-14). One day, God will bring us, his sons and daughters, into eternity as "heirs of God and coheirs with Christ" (Romans 8:17), to share in the joy of the saints whose bodies we venerate with reverence. We are pilgrims of hope, living in this world but fixing our eyes on eternity: "For here we do not have an enduring city, but we are looking for the city that is to come" (Hebrews 13:14). Our heavenly Father delights to share his kingdom with us: "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32).

May we then be generous and loving to one another on earth, so that we may already taste the joy of God's kingdom here and now. For as Jesus said: "By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another" (John Fr. Tien Cao 13:35).
