READINGS AT MASS

- Ecclesiasticus 3:17-20, 28-29. Humble yourself and you will find favour with the Lord.
- Psalm 67. God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor
- *Hebrews 12:18-19,22-24*. You have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God
- *Luke 14:1,7-14*. All who exalt themselves shall be humbled and all who humble themselves shall be exalted.

Jesus Calls Us to Be Humble Beyond Self-Righteousness

"The better the wheat, the lower it bows." This metaphor captures the essence of the greatness of the humble, not the boastful. The first reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus reminds us that the more a great person is, the more it is necessary for that person to be humble, because although God is infinitely great, in Jesus, God is most humble (Eccle 3:19-21, 30-31).

The Gospel today helps us open our heart to the light of Christ. It helps us meditate on the meaning of humility. Humility is not a sign of weakness, and it is not a virtue of the weak or the fainthearted, but a virtue of the strong and of those who put their total trust in God. With humility, the deep peace of the Holy Spirit is born from within, in the form of fortitude and courage. We can say that the two virtues, peace and humility, are twin brothers and sisters of the same mother whose name is love; love of God and love of neighbors.

With humility we can conquer our original sin, which is like a mother of ingratitude, pride, jealousy, rebellion, and selfishness. The lesson of humility in today's Gospel starts when Jesus noticed how the Pharisees picked the places of honor. They thought that honor was something to be seen in a public place where everybody can see. They thought that honor was something of their choice, rather than something that is only bestowed by the Truth of God.

In contrast with the Pharisees, Jesus teaches us that humility is something true that comes from the heart. True humility is an expression of love for our neighbors that comes from the heart. For this reason, our Lord Jesus always helps us to change our heart so that our behavior and actions may also be changed. He teaches us to learn from him, for he is "gentle and humble in heart" (Mt 11:29). "Everyone who exalts themselves will be humbled, and everyone who humbles themselves will be exalted" (Lk 14:11). In some situations, humility is the ability to humbly admit our limitation, while admiring others for their goodness.

DIOCESE AND PARISH NEWS & NOTICES

- 1. Social Justice Statement: The New Zealand bishops have published their annual Social Justice Statement. It supports the celebration of Social Justice Week, which this year runs from September 7-13. The theme for this year's week is "Let's Build Peace Together". In their message, the bishops explain that the work of building peace is "the vocation of every Christian". - 2. Prayer Request: At their August 2023 Conference meeting, the bishops received a request from the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem (EOHSJ) in NZ for an annual day of prayer to be added to the liturgical calendar. In response, Conference agreed to ask EOHSJ to provide two prayers of the faithful to be offered to parishes throughout New Zealand for use in liturgy on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, Sunday, 14 September 2025. The EOHSJ has written to Conference providing the following prayers for this year:
- For the Order of the Holy Sepulchre and its work that the LORD will give unfailing help to the work of the Order as it seeks to support and strengthen the Church in Jerusalem and the Holy Land We pray to the Lord
- For the Christians of the Holy Land that God in His kindness will give grace and peace to all Christians who live and worship in the lands where Our Lord Jesus Christ walked and taught. And may they be strengthened to be witnesses of peace and reconciliation to all who live in those lands.... We pray to the Lord.
- 3. Mission Sisters Annual Appeal 2025: This year, with your help, we hope to support two new missions health care services in Bangladesh and hostel accommodation in Vietnam.
