READINGS AT MASS

- Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23. What do people gain by all their work?
- Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11. See the things that are above, where Christ is.
- Luke 12:13-21. To whom will all this wealth of yours go?

Jesus Teaches: A Person's Life Is Not Made Secure by What They Own (Luke 12:13-21)

From a worldly point of view, no one would call the man in today's Gospel parable foolish. In our modern context, he might even be admired as a successful millionaire. Like him, we too can be driven by the values the world promotes; always striving to upgrade, expand, and secure more material possessions. However, if we want to be truly wise, we must learn to trust in Jesus. Without God being part of the parable, the man appears wise in the eyes of the world. But in the eyes of God, he is deeply foolish, and he never even realizes it.

The foolishness of the rich man lies in this: he believed that his soul would benefit from his material wealth. He said to himself: "I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them. Then I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid up for many years to come; take life easy, eat, drink, and enjoy yourself." But in the light of God's wisdom, material wealth, unless it is transformed into acts of charity and used to alleviate the suffering of the poor and needy, is worthless in God's sight.

There's an imagined story that goes like this: A man dies and stands before God. God says to him, "I knew the world needed you. I made you for the world so that you could help it. How did it go?" The man replies, "Oh God, I didn't know your will. I was busy making a lot of money on earth." Surprised, God responds, "Oh! I didn't know you loved playing Monopoly."

Though fictional, this story captures the essence of the rich man's foolishness in the parable. It offers a sobering reminder for all of us, especially when we are overly concerned, anxious, or consumed by material pursuits. The immortality of the soul is far more important than the abundance of possessions. That is why Jesus, through this parable, highlights the true wisdom of life: the soul only finds lasting benefit in a relationship with God, expressed in love and acts of charity. As Jesus said: "Fool! This very night your soul will be demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be then? So it is with the one who stores up treasure for himself and is not rich in the sight of God."

Finally, regarding the true richness and wisdom of God St. Paul states "to those who by patiently doing good seek for glory and honor and immortality, God will give eternal life; while for those who are self-seeking and who obey not the truth but wickedness, there will be wrath and fury" (Rom 2:7–8). According to St. Thomas Aquinas: "The glory of this world is vain, because it is based on things outside a person, namely, in the trappings of wealth and in the opinion of men: 'They boast of the abundance of their riches'" (Ps 49:6). But the glory of God will be based on something within a person, as it says in Luke: 'The kingdom of God is within you'" (Luke 17:21).
