### Jesus Teaches Us to Be Persistent in Our Faith

The desire of Jesus is expressed in his words: "I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were already blazing!" (Luke 12:49). This fire is the flame of faith that he wants to burn brightly in every believer's heart.

When I gaze upon our parishioners, many of whom have faithfully returned to Sunday Mass for years, I see this fire alive among us. Their steady commitment to prayer, worship, and community life reflects the enduring faith that Jesus calls us to have. They remind me of the persistence of the widow in the Gospel, who never gave up seeking justice from the unjust judge (Luke 18:1–8).

At the heart of this parable, Jesus teaches us the importance of perseverance in faith and prayer. He assures us: "Will not God see justice done to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night, even when he delays to help them? I tell you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily" (Luke 18:7–8). Yet Jesus also leaves us with a challenging question: "But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Luke 18:8). This question invites us to continue believing, praying, and living with the breath of the Spirit that comes from his Word and Sacraments. Like the faithful widow, and like so many of our parishioners who keep returning to the Lord's table week after week, we are called to remain steadfast, trusting that our perseverance will prepare us as a community of faith waiting in hope for Jesus' return. Or when your friends, children or grandchildren who return to you from their adventures, will they see you pray?

Today's Psalm reminds us: "Our help is from the Lord, who made heaven and earth." (Psalm 121:2). Prayer sustains our faith to believe, nourishes our hope, and ignites our love for God and neighbor. As Pope Francis reminds us, "Men and women who pray know that hope is stronger than discouragement." Many people say, "I used to think that through prayer I could change the world, but as I grew older, I realized that prayer changes me." The breath of faith is prayer: we grow in faith as we learn to pray. Our parish has truly been a school of prayer. After certain passages in life, we come to realize that without faith we could not have endured, and that our strength was prayer: not only our own, but also the prayer of our brothers and sisters, the community that accompanied and supported us, and those who prayed for and with us. Thus, we are called to pray and to teach one another how to pray to pass on the lamp of faith and the oil of prayer from generation to generation. As Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI once said: "If the lungs of prayer and the Word of God do not nourish the breath of spiritual life, we risk suffocating in the midst of a thousand daily cares."
