READINGS AT MASS

Malachi 3:19-20. The prophet Malachi warns those who refuse to take the challenge of religious renewal seriously, because in that very renewal lies their true hope.

2 Thessalonians 3:7-12. Paul is blunt in his comments on those whose self centredness had made them lose sight of the centrality of the Gospel and the imperative to proclaim the good news.

Luke 21:5-19. Jesus uses the image of the destruction of the Temple at Jerusalem to impress upon his hearers the transience of life and the need to be constantly on the alert.

Jesus Christ, the Ultimate and Immortal Temple (Luke 21:5-19)

Last Sunday, 9th November, we celebrated the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, a visible symbol and witness of hope, unity, restoration, and renewal. It reminds us of the importance of a place of worship, a sacred space where God and his people meet. As it is written in Isaiah: "For my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples" (Is 56:7). The "house" refers to the Temple in Jerusalem, yet Isaiah emphasizes universal worship, open not only to Israel but to all nations. However, what is physical belongs to the realm of the physical and the mortal, because the ultimate Temple of God is Christ Himself. In him, the Holy Spirit dwells and the fullness of God is found (Eph 2:19–22).

This Sunday's Gospel draws our attention to the end times (Luke 21:5–19). St. Luke records that as some people admired the Temple in Jerusalem, its fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, "The time will come when not a single stone will be left on another; everything will be destroyed." Yet Jesus foretold the coming of a Temple in which the true worshippers of God would be kept safe. Even though they would be hated by all on account of his name, not a hair of their heads would be lost. What is immortal cannot be destroyed. This means that our communion with Jesus now will endure for eternity, regardless of what may happen to us and around us. Jesus assures us: "Your endurance will win you your lives." ultimately, Jesus Christ is the ultimate and immortal Temple, he is our hope, our unity, our renewal, and our victory over mortality.

Prayers for Those Affected by Natural Disasters: Our community has been requested to pray and support those who have suffered from the recent natural disaster of flood and earthquakes around the world, in particular in the Philippines and in Vietnam. Let us pray for them, and may our actions reflect our faith and commitment to charity.
- 5. This Sunday, 16th November Is World Day Of The Poor: Each year, the Church is called to listen to the cry of the poor and empower those who have been trapped in cycles of poverty. Pope Leo has written a message with the theme "You are my hope". Poverty is driven by many factors a lot of them structural inequalities that have existed for centuries: Helping the poor is a matter of justice before a question of charity. As Saint Augustine observed: "You give bread to a hungry person; but it would be better if none were hungry, so that you would have no need to give it away. You clothe the naked, but would that all were clothed and that there be no need for supply this lack". The World Day of the Poor is an annual opportunity for people to come together, reflect on how to help those in need, and take action to end cycles of poverty. The New Zealand Catholic Bishops have entrusted this day to Caritas because of our work to alleviate poverty around the world.
