## Jesus said, "Today you will be with me in Paradise"

As we celebrate the solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, we are invited to reflect on the eternal hope offered to us by the Lord. Only Jesus can determine whether we are in the Kingdom of God or outside of it, regardless of our good works or our sinful past. Even the thief who was crucified alongside Jesus, deserving of the death penalty, was forgiven and saved by Him, no matter the wrongs he had committed or the harm he had caused. This event gives us hope, for as it is often said, "Every saint has a past, and every sinner has a future." An encounter with Jesus, combined with a repentant heart, transforms a sinner into a saint. If we humble ourselves before Christ, we all have a chance, even a better chance than the good thief, because as we read this reflection, we still have more time than he had. The good thief is remembered for his repentance and faith in his final moments, which led to Jesus' promise that he would enter Paradise that very day. Although he is especially honoured as the patron saint of repentant thieves and prisoners, his story stands as a powerful symbol of God's mercy for all.

As we celebrate this solemnity at the close of the liturgical year, let us remember that Jesus is King of kings and Lord of lords, King of heaven and earth. St. Paul wrote to the Philippians: "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (3:20). The Kingdom of Jesus is that reality of which Scripture says: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived what God has prepared for those who love Him" (1 Cor 2:9). And to the Romans Paul wrote: "The kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit" (Rm14:17). As Jesus spoke to the repentant thief, may the Holy Spirit whisper to our hearts at the final moment of our lives: "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

Lastly, as we offer God the sacrifice of the Eucharist as a parish community, may the human race be reconciled to God, and may Jesus bestow upon all nations the gifts of unity and peace.
