It was inspiring to gather ideas for our own sensory garden and to learn how we can create a native pathway for bees, birds, and our five senses to enjoy. We also enjoyed designing our own plant covers and meeting Lucky the sheep who knows 30 commands.

Senior School Camp to Dunedin

Day 2: Our day started with a drive around the Otago Peninsula to the NZ Marine Studies Centre. The students enjoyed this hands-on experience while learning about the creatures that live in our ocean. After exploring the tanks inside, they couldn't wait to walk down to the Rocky Shore to discover some creatures for themselves. Working in teams, they used a metre quadrat to make observations and record their findings like real scientists.

The Otago Museum Planetarium was a great spot to listen to our educator and watch our galaxy, stars, celestial bodies and planets moving all around us. He taught us a great deal, including how to locate significant stars in our night sky and how the star signs were named.

After this busy day, we refuelled with nachos at the holiday park. Next, it was time for Ten Pin Bowling at Bowl Line in Kaikorai Valley. There were a few gutter balls to start, but the students soon got the hang of it and had heaps of fun!

Day 3: We set off for the Royal Albatross Centre at Taiaroa Head. It was a long, windy drive, but we enjoyed spotting new things along the way. We could see across to Port Chalmers and watch the cargo ship coming into the harbour.

Once we arrived, we met our educator, Libby, and she turned Maddie into an Albatross! The students learnt about the Life Cycle of an Albatross and some species that are at risk. We walked up a massive hill to the Richdale Observatory to view the Albatross and Shag through the glass windows.

Afterwards, we went on a Fort Tour to discover the Armstrong Disappearing Gun, which was installed in 1889. We wandered through underground tunnels until we got to the gun. This was built a very long time ago, in case they were ever invaded. Luckily, the gun never had to be used!
